


The population of Hyde Godley is just larger than the Tameside average of 11,796 people. 63% of this population is between the ages of 16 and 64 years old, which is just above the borough average of 62%.

Since 2013, all three of the wider age bands have grown, most notably the working age population, which grew by 170 people.

The white population of Hyde Godley is 89.9%, which is lower than the Tameside average of 91%. The Bangladeshi population, however, significantly exceeds the average value of 2%.



35.3% of GCSE students in Hyde Godley achieve grades 5 and above in their English and Maths qualifications, which is below the Tameside average of 40.8%.

The ward has a slightly lower-than-average school readiness percentage, with Tameside's average value being 66%, although the ward's school readiness has improved somewhat since 2017.

22.2% of residents have no qualifications, which is above the Tameside average of 19%.



Hyde Godley is more deprived than the Tameside average; the IMD deprivation score for Hyde Godley is 38.6, which is higher than the borough's average score of 28.8.

The proportion of children living in poverty in the ward, 37.0%, is 7.5% above the Tameside average.

On average, 70% of adults in Tameside are employed, so Hyde Godley's employment rate of 66.2% is below average for the borough. The proportion of students is slightly lower than the average value of 4.8%.

Self-Employed

This map shows the deprivation rankings of the LSOAs (small areas of around 1500 people) which make up the ward. Those in decile 1 are within the top 10% deprived LSOAs in the country.





The majority of properties in Hyde Godley are owner occupied, with average market sale prices slightly below the Tameside average of £139,412. The percentage of private rented homes in Hyde Godley is just lower than the Tameside average of 14.2%.

11.7% of households are in fuel poverty, which is above the average of 10.2%, however there are a below average number of homes without central heating installed; the Tameside average central heating installation percentage is 97.3%.

48.4% of the residences in Hyde Godley are terraced houses or bungalows, which is much more than the Tameside average value of 35.7%.






Travel Time to the Nearest GP's Surgery in minutes

Hyde Godley doesn't contain any hot food takeaways, but has a higher-than-average number of licenced premises per 1000 people. Travel times to the nearest GP's surgery without the use of a car are below Tameside average.

There are three GP's surgeries in the ward, all of which have been rated as good or outstanding by the Care Quality Commission, which monitors healthcare practices nationally.

Hyde Godley contains seven pharmacies; the area, like all of Tameside, has sufficient pharmacy access.










Hyde Godley has above average hospital admission rates for COPD and children under five years old. The prevalence of childhood obesity is significantly higher than the Tameside average for both reception and year six pupils.

The biggest cause of death in Hyde Godley is cancer, which is responsible for one in four of all deaths in the ward.

The male and female healthy life expectancies are lower than the Tameside averages of 58.1 years old and 57.6 years old respectively.





The total crime rate in Hyde Godley is higher than the Tameside average of 207.7 offences per 1000 people. Hyde Godley has a higher rate of anti-social behaviour offences than the Tameside average, and also has a significantly higher rate of violent and sexual offences per 1000 people. The rate of domestic abuse offences is also higher than average, and it is the third most committed crime in the ward.

Hyde Godley has a significantly higher-than-average rate of theft offences reported to the police compared to Tameside as a whole, and theft is the most committed crime in the area.
