




The population of St Peter's is significantly larger than the Tameside average of 11,796 people. 63% of this population is between the ages of 16 and 64 years old, which is more than the borough average of 62%.

Since 2013, all three of the wider age bands have increased in size, all growing by between 100 and 200 people.

The white population of St Peter's is 70.3%, which is lower than the Tameside average of 91%; the Pakistani, Bangladeshi, and Indian populations all exceed their average proportions of 2% each.



## Percentage of "good passes" (grades 5+) in GCSE English and Maths



38% of GCSE students in St Peter's achieve grades 5 and above in their English and Maths qualifications, which falls below the Tameside average of 40.8%.

The ward has a lower-than-average school readiness percentage, with Tameside's average value being 66%, although the ward's school readiness has improved since 2017.

27% of residents have no qualifications, which is significantly more than the Tameside average of 19%.



St Peter's is significantly more deprived than the Tameside average; the IMD deprivation score for St Peter's is 49.0, which is higher than the borough's average score of 28.8.

The proportion of children living in poverty in the ward, 47.0%, is 17.5% above the Tameside average.

On average, 70% of adults in Tameside are employed, so the ward's employment rate of 60.0% is below average for the borough, although the proportion of students is higher than the average value of 4.8%.

This map shows the deprivation rankings of the LSOAs (small areas of around 1500 people) which make up the ward. Those in decile 1 are within the top 10% deprived LSOAs in the country.




## Mean House Sale Prices



37% of properties in St Peter's are owner occupied, with average market sale prices below the Tameside average of £139,412. The percentage of private rented homes in St Peter's is greater than the Tameside average of 14.2%.

13.2% of households are in fuel poverty, which is above the average of 10.2%, and there are an above average number of homes without central heating installed; the Tameside average central heating installation percentage is 97.3%.

48.1% of the residences in St Peter's are terraced houses or bungalows, which is much more than the Tameside average value of 35.7%.






## Travel Time to the Nearest GP's Surgery in minutes

St Peter's has fewer hot food takeaways and licenced premises per 1000 people than the Tameside average, and has lower-than-average travel times to the nearest GP's surgery both with and without the use of a car.

There are five GP's surgeries in the ward, all of which have been rated as good or outstanding by the Care Quality Commission, which monitors healthcare practices nationally.

St Peter's contains fourteen pharmacies which contribute to the area, and all of Tameside, having sufficient pharmacy access.





## Hospital Admission Rates per 100,000 people




St Peter's has above average hospital admission rates, particularly for self harm and COPD. The prevalence of childhood obesity in reception class children is significantly higher than the Tameside average, but only slightly more year six students are obese than the Tameside average percentage.

The biggest cause of death in St Peter's is heart disease, which is responsible for one in three of all deaths in the ward.

The male and female healthy life expectancies are lower than the borough averages of 58.1 years old and 57.6 years old respectively.

## Childhood Obesity Percentages







The total crime rate in St Peter's is nearly 2.5 times the Tameside average of 207.7 offences per 1000 people. St Peter's has a significantly above average rate of anti-social behaviour offences, and also has a significantly higher rate of domestic abuse per 1000 people. The rate of violent and sexual offences is also much higher than average, and it is the third most committed crime in the ward.

St Peter's has a significantly higher-than-average rate of theft offences reported to the police compared to Tameside as a whole, and theft is the most committed crime in the area.
